

From the desk of Pr. Tom

December: A Season of Joy

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As December settles in with its cooler days and longer nights, we find ourselves on the threshold of Advent - a season of waiting, anticipating, and preparing. This month, we are invited to reflect on the deep joy that comes from the arrival of Christ into the world and the gift of joy that he continues to offer us today.

The Joy of Advent: Expecting the Savior

The word "Advent" comes from the Latin *adventus*, meaning *coming*. This season is a time of eager expectation as we prepare our hearts for the birth of Jesus, the light of the world. Joy is central to the message of Advent, for the coming of Christ brings not only hope but a deep, abiding joy to all who believe.

The angelic proclamation to the shepherds in Luke 2:10-11 says it all: "I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord." The joy that the shepherds felt at that moment was not based on earthly circumstances, but on the divine reality that God was with them - Emmanuel.

A Sound Bath Worship Service: An Immersive Spiritual Experience

In the quiet hum of modern life, many people seek deeper spiritual connection and peace, often through practices that transcend traditional rituals. One such practice which has gained popularity in recent years is the sound bath worship service, a unique blend of spiritual reflection and auditory immersion designed to foster mindfulness, healing, and connection with the divine.

What is a Sound Bath?

A sound bath is a meditative experience where participants are enveloped by healing sounds created by singing bowls. These bowls produce a range of frequencies that can help calm the mind, lower stress levels, and promote emotional balance. The term "sound bath" refers to the idea of being "bathed" in sound waves, allowing the vibrations to wash over and through the body, mind, and spirit.

The Worship Element

In the context of a worship service, the sound bath

In many traditions, sound is believed to be a powerful conduit for spiritual healing and transformation. The vibrations created by the bowls can help clear blockages, balance the energy centers of the body, and deepen one's connection to God.

A Holistic Experience

The beauty of a sound bath worship service lies in its holistic nature. The gentle, immersive nature of the sounds allows participants to let go of the mental clutter that often crowds the mind during traditional prayer or meditation. Some may experience visions, heightened emotions, or deep moments of insight, while others simply find themselves enveloped in a sense of peace and calm.

For those seeking an alternative or complement to more conventional worship practices, a sound bath worship service can offer a unique opportunity to experience spirituality through the healing power of sound. It allows participants to engage with their faith on a deeper level, transcending the limitations of words or thoughts, and embracing the profound resonance of the universe.

Sound bath worship services are a contemporary spiritual practice that combines the ancient art of sound healing with modern worship experiences. Whether used for meditation, reflection, or connection, these services offer a transformative and deeply peaceful way to engage with spirituality in a world that often feels disconnected from its deeper rhythms. In a sound bath, the echoes of the divine are heard not through words, but through the very vibrations of the universe itself.

Celebrate Christmas as you wish, perhaps with candy canes and Santa Claus and presents all around. Keep in mind that this is all for our human vanity. The REAL Christmas is the birth of our Savior Jesus Christ. Keep Him in your heart and your mind as you go through the motions of a secular Christmas. Without Jesus, there is no Christmas!

Above all, love one another as Christ loves you!

Creation Care with Eco-Friendly Wrapping

As Christmas approaches, here are some ideas for earthfriendly wrapping. Consider using alternatives to traditional wrapping, such as:

- Newspaper or brown paper rolls (kids can decorate with markers or Christmas card cut-outs)
- Reusable shopping bags (preferably cotton)
- Re-use gift bags (make it fun see how many years you can use the same one)
- Christmas cards make great gift tags
- Wrap items in a t-shirt
- Wrap items in a tablecloth or blanket
- Instead of ribbon,
 - Use 100% cotton yarn (such as Sugar and Cream, available in many colors)
 - Use jute twine (100% biodegradable); add a fresh holly sprig for color
- Avoid shiny, glossy wrapping, as it is not recyclable
- If giving multiple gifts to a person/family, place them unwrapped in one (reusable) bag and have the recipient select one at a time. (No peeking inside first!)
